

Dear Residents,

Significant progress has been made on your golf course and improvements are still being made. With that in mind, it is a good time to review some of the basic golf course rules and regulations as set forth in the OHCC Homeowners Association Handbook of Rules and Regulations. We want to keep the course in pristine condition as we head into fall.

Users: Residents, and guests when accompanied by a resident, may play golf on the Golf Course and/or use the practice areas. Residents are limited to three (3) guests. For safety reasons no spectators, pedestrians, children under ten (10) years of age or pets are allowed on the Golf Course or practice areas at any time. No group larger than a foursome (4) is permitted.

Bag Tag: All residents who play golf must have an OHCC bag tag. While on the golf course residents must display their bag tag. (Need one? Please go to the Clubhouse front desk.)

No items on Tee Box Areas: No bag carts, motorized bag carts, carry stands, or golf bags are to be placed on the tee areas or on greens or aprons. Carts must not be taken between bunkers and greens.

Motorized Vehicles on Course: Carts must have a current permit each year. Single rider carts should not be driven on to tee boxes, within 10 feet of greens, nor between greens and bunkers. Single-rider carts shall not use the paved area to enter or exit the Golf Course or in the Golf Casa Area.

Care of Greens: Before putting out, move carts, bags, or carry stands to the side of the green closest to the next tee. Please repair your ball marks (a great video on how to properly repair a ball mark can be found on the Golf Club's website at www.ohgc.net).

Posted Rules Take Precedence: Examples include course closure due to inclement weather, raking sand traps and placing the rake head in the trap when done, and special drop zones. Additional posted rules can be found on the display boards at the Golf Casa.

Practice Rules: The Golf Course is designed for playing; therefore, all practice must be done in designated practice areas. Practicing on the golf course, other than hitting two balls, is prohibited.

Practice Putting Green and Chipping Restrictions: The practice putting green is for putting only. The practice chipping green shall be used for chipping and pitching. Do not hit balls toward number 9 or 18 greens.

Tees required: Tees must be used under the golf ball at all times when playing the initial drive from the tee area.

Responsibility for Damage: All golf players (residents and guests) are personally responsible for any injury to any person, damage to a home or to personal property, and must report such damage to the affected resident and to the Clubhouse Front Desk at the end of play.

Appropriate Clothing: Only appropriate clothing shall be worn on the course. No tank tops, short shorts, swimsuits, or cut-off jeans are allowed. Gentlemen must wear collared shirts. Soft-

spike golf shoes are recommended. Metal-spiked shoes are prohibited. Flat-soled shoes are worn only at a player's own risk. Shoes with heels are not permitted. Dress code applies to all guests.

Additional Courtesies:

- a. Please knock the sand off your shoes when exiting a sand trap.
- b. Please repair all divots
- c. Please yell a hearty "FORE!!!" if you hit an errant shot and think there is a remote chance it will hit another player.
- d. Golf Course play begins at 7:50AM

More detailed rules and regulations are found on pages 24-27 of the Handbook, and many are found on the back of your bag tag.

These rules and regulations help ensure that you and your guests have a fun and safe experience while playing.
