ONE MINUTE THEORY



It is the job of each person to keep the place of play moving.

You should be keeping up with the team in front of you not the team behind.

Play ready golf...first one to the tee, tee off. Forget honors.

Is it really necessary to take 5 or 6 swings before teeing off? Swing while you are waiting.

Be prepared at the tee. Do not wait until your turn to select a club. Have it in your hand and be ready to step forward onto the tee.

As you are going up the fairway, think about the club you might use when you reach your ball.

Put carts on the side of green closest to the next tee.

First one on the tee, fix divots.

Don't wait for people to mark ball. Ask them, and mark the ball yourself.

Rake for the person in the sand so they can go to their ball.

If someone is raking the sand, others go to the green and start putting.

After you hole your ball, yell out your score. Good way to remember.

One person should be holding the flag, ready to put it in the cup when the last person is putting. Don't wait until they are finished putting to bend down and get flag.

If people are pushing you at every hole, let them play through or send 2 people on. If 2 people go on, tee off. Don't just stand there waiting for your teammates.

When finished at a hole, move on. Don't stand around and fill in score card. Do that at the next hole.

Saving one minute means 18 minutes at the end of play.
