

OHGC BOARD MEETING

May 2, 2026

Executive Board Members Present: Mike Guillory, Mark Deutman, Mary LaForte, Robbie Sullivan.

Call to Order: 9:00 AM.

Approval of Minutes: Tom Vaccaro moved to approve the minutes of the last meeting with a second from Alan Colson. The motion was passed.

Treasurer's Report: Mary reported the Club still has \$19,851.02, the same amount as reported in the last General Meeting with no transactions taken place.

OLD BUSINESS:

Unknown Golf Transition and comparing software with different handicap input failures for leaderboard payouts. Alan reported there are still issues to deal with in transitioning to Unknown Golf including signup issues, no program for usual group signups and tee times, team handicap questions, tee time manipulation, how to reply to an issue and handicap analysis. Payout labels are unavailable and must be done by hand. There is also the difficulty for individual leagues to send emails to the membership.

Alan scheduled a meeting with Unknown Golf, but they cancelled. They would like to have the developers present but they were unavailable. He will continue to attempt scheduling with Unknown. Alan encouraged all concerns

be brought to him and not directly to Unknown Golf. User training program is still being planned.

Handicaps: Player rounds are being added to Unknown Golf for handicap computations and needed to transition off Golf Genius. In comparing handicaps from Golf Genius to Unknown Golf, it has been noted there is a very small variance between the two. Alan would like handicap reports made available to post on the website. The Unknown revision process runs every night and Alan can run it manually. It was noted that Fling, Niners and Guys & Dolls are already solely using Unknown Golf.

Lake/Back Nine Opening: Mark reported there has been a successful well-to-lake water test. The testing of the spillway, which was made of rock, resulted in the rock being washed away. The need for a concrete spillway was noted and construction is underway. The boulder on hole 17 has been moved. The pump runs quietly, and the Master Board is looking at a beautification process to hide the pump. They plan to put “No Fishing” and “Do Not Enter” signs around the lake and do not feel the need for a nearby life preserver or other safety measures. The turf is being laid and irrigation hooked up by O’Connell. Mark will send updated pictures to Mike and Jim to add to the website and send to the membership.

Course maintenance went well, but the bunkers were not updated. There is still too much sand on the bunker faces and not enough on the bottoms.

Grand Opening Tournament: No date yet for the Grand Opening Tournament as there is no set date for opening of the full course.

NEW BUSINESS:

Rewriting Local Rule - Lost Ball or OB: Natalie noted there is still member confusion regarding how to handle lost balls and out of bounds. After much discussion, the following change to our local rule was proposed: Replace our existing local rule regarding out of bounds and lost balls with a rule to treat all white staked areas as red penalty areas and no play zones. Relief will be two club lengths no closer to the hole with a one-stroke penalty. Players will be

encouraged to hit a provisional ball if they believe their ball was lost. This will be applied to tournaments only at this time. Tom moved to approve this change and Mark seconded. The motion was passed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Membership: Tom reported we have 623 Club members, 299 being women and 324 being men. There have been 119 new members since October 1. There are 136 Fling golfers. He also noted payments by check at 67% which is up from last year.

Women's Golf: In Debbie's absence, Mike reported Women's Golf will not be celebrating Mother's Day in May. A two-day tournament in June along with Men's Golf is being considered to celebrate both Mother's and Father's Day.

Men's Golf: Todd reported the Father's Day Tournament will be cancelled if the full course is not open. He also noted problems with tee sheets due to members not signing up on both platforms. It was noted that nonclub players often don't know when open golf is allowed since the schedule is not on the website. Annette provides Club tee times to the front desk and posts them at the casa. It was suggested to post them on the website and Teresa will add that information to her next OHCC Living article.

Touring Amateurs: Mike reported the next Touring Amateurs Tournament is May 11 at the Welks. So far 100 players have signed up. JC Golf fees have gone up and Mike is working with sponsorship. Mike and Annette will be stepping down from running the tournaments next year and no one has stepped up yet to take over. Many suggestions were discussed which included changing to player tee times and not having a tournament, breaking up the parts by making the tournament a team-led event with different persons handling sponsorship, Unknown Golf, securing courses, etc. Mike and Annette are willing to help with the transition. It was suggested if Touring Amateurs does not continue, to change to OHGC events only, such as Special Tournaments. This will provide sponsor money for all inhouse tournaments such as having the ability to have food served at each tournament.

It was agreed all leagues should become more team oriented with more members involved in the activities of running their leagues. This has already happened with Women's Golf but no member of Men's Golf has offered to help yet. Mark noted the Start-Up Manual for Unknown Golf is difficult to use.

Guys & Dolls: Teresa reported there are approximately 150 players signed up for the next Guys & Dolls on May 9. There will be a Social Mixer in the lanai 10:00 to 3:00.

Fling Golf: Don reported a doubling of players for Friday's Fling and Swing events over the last three months. Wednesday's tournament now includes a side bet – "Bingo, Bango, Bongo." Don noted there has been a problem with putting payouts in mail tubes as three have gone missing. He will now distribute payouts at the next team event.

Niners: Mike reported having larger groups for Niners and having to start play later due to following larger Men's Golf often not finishing by 12:30. This results in Niners last group finishing their round around 4:00. He may need to cap his players at 40. It was suggested that starting times for Tuesday Men's Golf be moved up, but times may move no earlier than 7:50 due to O'Connell's morning course responsibilities. It is thought Niners may be growing as players have gotten used to playing nine holes and not interested in returning to a full course. The issue will be discussed further if this becomes a problem. A suggestion was made to move Niners to Friday mornings.

Computer Operations: Alan suggested having more backup help for the leagues, maybe starting with scoring, then moving to tee sheets, etc.

He also noted the "Help" section of Unknown Golf is very confusing and outdated. He will make a "Cheat Sheet" to help and will send out. (See attached sheet)

Casa Facilities: Sue noted there are two golf clubs left with one needing to be donated. It was noted there may need to be some changes made to the next set of scorecards to reflect rules changes but only if the Golf Committee

makes the change permanent. At this time the change will only be used during tournaments.

Publicity: It was noted Teresa's latest article in OHCC Living was very interesting and informative. She may add information on where to find "What's Happening." She would like to have some Fling Tournament photos from the outside tournament at St. Mark's Executive Course to add to her next article. Teresa is open to suggestions for future articles.

Sunshine: It was noted that Sandy Lang's husband passed several months ago. Anyone who hears of a past or present member's passing, please let Mike know so he can let the membership know and also Sue Bourland, Sunshine Chairperson, so she can send a sympathy card.

Hospitality: Terry reported on our Summer Party to be held June 18 with a Hawaiian theme. She is planning on a Hawaiian dance troupe and possibly some ukeleles playing in the entrance area to the party. Terry is also planning for 18 gift baskets, a member favorite. She received many signups for volunteers. She also suggests Teresa add the party to her June article. The next quarterly meeting comes up in July and the Volunteer party the end of October. Terry encouraged everyone to keep a record of all volunteers so no one will be left out. She could use help with flyers and Teresa and Mark volunteered to help.
